Established on the 1st of July 1971, Bhawanipur Hastinapur Bijni (B.H.B.) College is the oldest institution in 41, Bhawanipur Legislative Assembly Constituency, a segment of Kokrajhar Parliamentary Constituency of Assam which is a reserved seat for scheduled tribes.

Remedial Coaching :

The College conducts UGC sponsored Remedial Coaching at the TDC level for the students of the Minority Communities and closely monitors their progress.

N.S.S., N.C.C. and Gymnasium :

There is a unit of N.S.S. in the college, which carries out various social work and extension education activities under the guidance of the N.S.S. Programme Officer, Prof. Bhaskar Kakati.

Admission Procedure:

- A) Application for admission into the college should be made in the prescribed application form issued by the college office on payment of Rs. 100.00 (Rupees One hundred) only.
- B) Students are selected for admission into the college on the basis of their academic record.
- C) There is reservation of seats for students belonging to ST/SC/OBC/MOBC as per Government rules.
- D) Students are required to produce original copies of the following documents at the time of admission.
 - a. Marksheet of the last qualifying examination.
 - b. Age Certificate (H.S.L.C. pass certificate / admit card etc.)
 - c. Character certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.
 - d. Caste certificate where necessary.
 - e. One copy of passport size photograph
 - f. Two stamp size photograph for identity card
- E) A student failing to get admitted in the same year of passing will have to submit a gap certificate from the Head of the institution attended last stating the cause / causes for gap to the satisfaction of the Principal.
- F) The college authority reserves the right to reject an application for admission without assigning any reason for the same.

Students' Aid Fund:

The college has a students' aid fund for helping the poor students. Poor but meritorious students who do not get any scholarship are granted some monetary help from this fund. The aid is disbursed by a committee.

College Merit Prize:

The college awards the following Merit Prizes to the deserving students.

- (i) A cash prize of Rs. 500.00 (Rupees Five Hundred) only will be awarded to each student securing 75% or more marks in aggregate in H.S. Final Examination.
- (ii) A cash prize of Rs. 700.00 (Rupees Seven Hundred) only will be awarded to each student securing 1st Class in Major Course (in any subject) in the TDC Final Examination.
- (iii) A cash award of Rs. 1000.00 (Rupees One thousand) only by Sri Phanindra Kumar Choudhury

- in memory of Late Somendra Kumar Choudhury to the student securing the highest marks in the Higher Secondary Final examination.
- (iv) A cash award of Rs. 1000.00 (Rupees One thousand) only by Sri Ramkrishna Talukdar in memory of Late Kashinath Talukdar to the student securing the highest marks in major subjects.
 - (v) A cash award of Rs. 1000.00 (Rupees One thousand) only by Mr. Praneswar Baishya in memory of Late Ganakrishna Baishya to the girl student obtaining the highest marks in the B.A. final examination.
 - (vi) A cash award of Rs. 1001.00 (Rupees One Thousand one) only by Mr. Satish Chandra Basumatary in memory of Late Phatik Ch. Basumatary to the girl student securing the highest marks in the Higher Secondary Final examination.
 - (vii) A cash award of Rs. 2000.00 (Rupees Two Thousand) only by Dr. Bibha Bharali, Reader, G.U. in memory of Late Sukhna Ram Bharali to the students securing the highest marks in Assamese (Major) in the B. A. Final Examination.

Library:

The college library has a good collection of books (both text and reference) on various subjects to meet the needs of the students as well as the teachers. Daily Newspaper and selected journals are also regularly subscribed. The library has been computerized. The reading room of the library provides ample facilities for reading to a large number of students as well as teachers. Reprographic facilities are also available in the library.

Working hours: 9:30 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. on all working days.

Rules for the Library:

- (i) The students are provided with Borrower Cards. These cards are strictly non-transferable. The cards must be surrendered at the end of the academic session.
- (ii) One Borrower Card is issued to each student of H.S. Class / TDC General Course and he / she can borrow one book at a time. Two Borrower cards are issued to each student of Major Course and he /she can borrow two books at a time.
- (iii) No student is allowed to keep a book for more that 10 days in any case. A fine of Rs. 50/- (Rupees Fifty) only will be imposed for each day for book / books retained beyond the specified time. However, borrowed book / books, if returned before the expiry of the specified date, may be re-issued for a period of another 10 days.
- (iv) Any book lost, or damaged must be replaced by the borrower. If the book is one of a series and can not be obtained singly, the whole set must be replaced by the borrower.

Book Bank:

The college has a Book Bank for helping the poor students with necessary text and reference books.

College Uniform:

It is compulsory for the students of the college to wear uniform as prescribed below.

(a) For Boys: **Shirt and Trousers**

In addition to the prescribed uniform, students may be allowed to wear traditional dresses in conformity with the colour of the prescribed uniform mentioned above. However, decency in respect of dresses should strictly be maintained.

Anti Ragging Measures

In pursuance to the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 08 - 05 - 2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009, the UGC framed "UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009" which were notified on 17th June 2009 and are to be mandatorily followed by all universities and colleges. The Regulations are available on the UGC website, i.e. www.ugc.ac.in.

Examination:

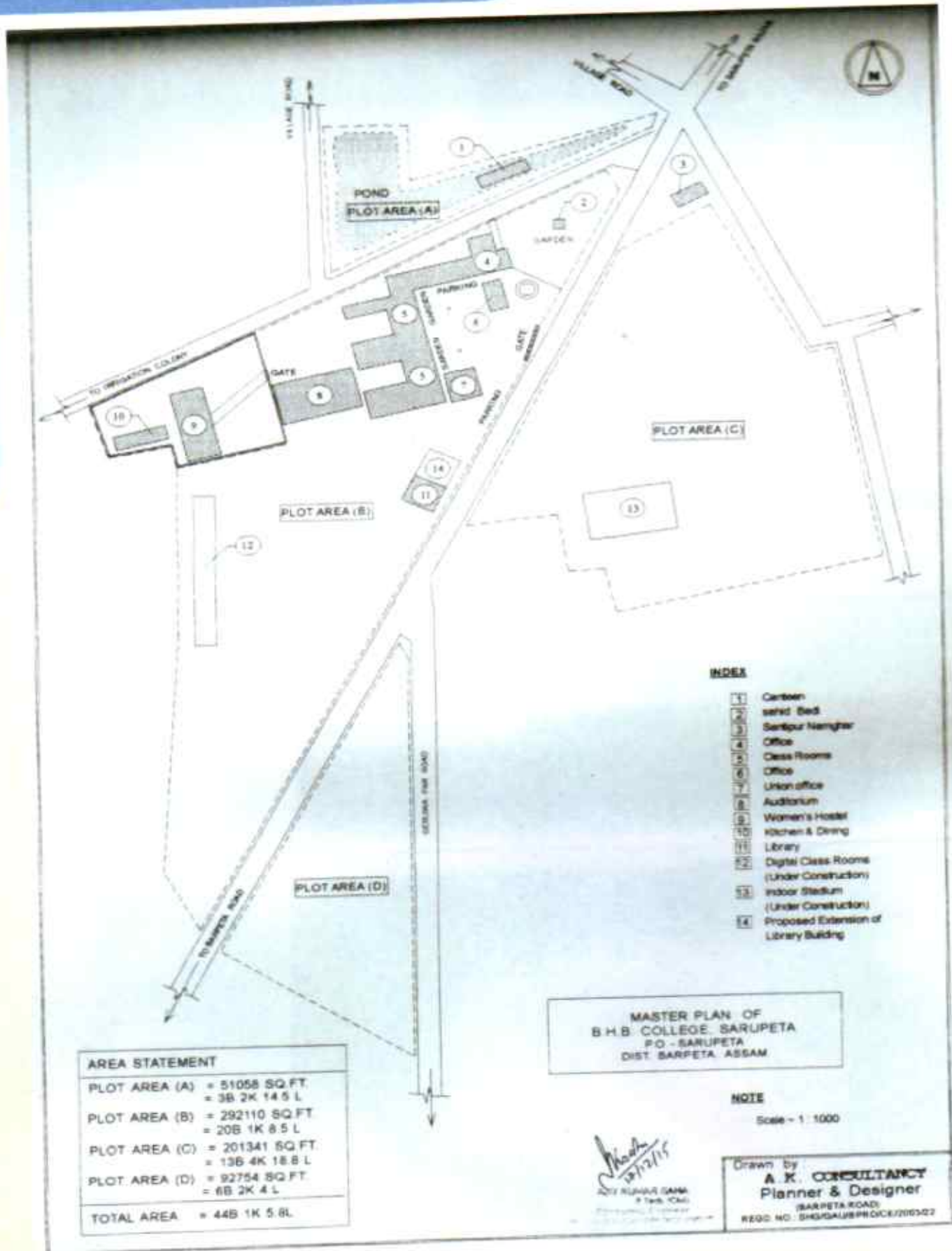

Regulation of TOC for Semester System
& with Choice based Credit and Grading System.

1. A TOC shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Year. The schedule for Semester system shall be as shown below:
 - (a) First, Third and Ffth Semester: August 1-Dec-31 (including examinations)
 - (b) Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester : January 1—June -30 (including examinations)
 - (c) Semester Break: July 1- July 31.The Academic Calendar and schedule for Semester System is given in Annexure-I.
Course Structure under Semester System given in Annexure-II.
2. Student's performance should be monitored through out the Semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the Students performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following :
Internal Evaluation : 20% Marks
External Evaluation : 80% Marks
3. Internal Evaluation should be based on two sessional examinations, home assignments, Seminars, and library work in each Semester. The schedule for internal evaluation is given in Annexure-I. The procedure for internal evaluation is given in Annexure-III.
4. External Evaluation should be through a final examination at the end on the Semester. The procedure for external evaluation is given in Annexure-IV.
5. The pass marks in each theory paper is 30 % and that in each practical paper is 40%.
6. In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation







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
