Bhawanipur Hastinapur Bijni (B.H.B.) College began life as an institution of higher education on 1st July 1971 at Sarupeta, located centrally in a wide area which accommodates three mouzas-Bhawanipur Hastinapur and Bijni under Bajali sub-division of Barpeta District. It had its beginnings at the Sarupeta High School Campus with a small batch of students and it subsequently moved to its present site in 1976. The college could achieve rapid growth and expansion due to the untiring efforts of the local people, the members of both the teaching and non-teaching staff, and

the Governing Body of the college. The progress of the college went along desired lines and the Govt. of Assam brought it under the deficit grant-in aid system in 1971. 10. Vocational Course:

With a view to inculcating the spirit of entrepreneurship among the students, the college has taken steps for introduction of various vocational subjects. Functional English, a vocational subject has already been introduced under the UGC Scheme. A student of Three Year Degree Course (General) may take up this vocational subject in lieu of any conventional elective subject. The Department of Functional English provides excellent library and laboratory facilities for the students.

11. Career Oriented Programme:

(A) The college conducts the following UGC sponsored career oriented programmes at the Three Year Degree level.

- (ii) Early Child Care and Education
- (iii) Entrepreneurship in Small-scale Industries.

(B) The college also offers Computer Application as an elective subject in the Three Year Degree Course (Arts).

12. Self-financing Course:

The college offers PGDCA course.

Besides it conducts certificate course in basic computer application with a view to providing the youth of the locality with the scope of learning basic computer application. The students of the college can join the course by paying nominal fee.

13. Remedial Coaching:

The college conducts UGC sponsored Remedial Coaching at the TDC level for the students of the Minority Communities and closely monitors their progress.

14. N.S.S. and N.C.C.:

There is a unit of N.S.S. in the college, which carries out various social work and extension education activities under the guidance of the N.S.S. Programme Officer.

There is also a wing of N.C.C.(both for boys and girls) in the college and a good number of students are receiving N.C.C. training.

15. Admission Procedure:

- (a) Application for admission into the college should be made in the prescribed application form issued by the college office on payment of Rs. (50.00)
- (b) Students are selected for admission into the college on the basis of their academic record.
- (c) Candidates are required to produce original copies of the following documents at the time of admission.
 - (i) Mark sheet of the last qualifying examination.
 - (ii) Age Certificate.
 - (iii) Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
 - (iv) Caste Certificate, wherever necessary.

Attested copies of these documents must be submitted at the time of admission.

16. Attendance:

A student must attend at least 75% of the classes held in the college, failing which he/she may not be allowed to appear at the H.S. 1st Year Annual / H.S.Final /TDC Part - I / TDC Part - II / TDC Part - III Examination.

- N.B. (i) Students of Major Course shall be required to pay extra fees.
(ii) Practical fees are to be paid where applicable.

18. Fees for Renewal:

The students of H.S. 2nd Year, TDC 2nd Year and TDC 3rd Year classes shall have to pay Renewal Fees on a date to be notified by the Principal of the college.

19. Identity Card:

An Identity Card is issued annually to every student.

20. Travelling Concession:

Students are entitled to travelling concession as per rules.

21. Scholarships:

Students are awarded both merit and other scholarships. The following categories of scholarships are available to the needy and deserving students of the college.

- (iv) A cash award of ₹ 1000/- (one thousand only) by Sri Ramkrishna Talukdar in memory of late Kashinath Talukdar to the student securing the highest mark in major subjects.
- (v) College will provide admission for both the classes (H.S. & T.D.C) free of cost to the students who secure 75% marks or above in aggregate in H.S.L.C/ Higher secondary (final) examination.

24. Students' Union:

There is a students' union of the college entitled "B.H.B. College Students' Union". The office bearers of the union are annually elected as per constitution of the union. The election of the students' union is conducted by a committee appointed by the Principal of the College.

27. Library:

The college library has a good collection of books (both text and reference) on various subjects to meet the needs of the students as well as the teachers. Daily Newspapers and selected journals are also regularly subscribed. The library has been computerised. The reading room of the library provides ample facilities for reading to a large number of students as well as teachers. Reprographic facilities are also available in the library.

Working hours: 9:30 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. on all working days.

28. Rules for the Library:

- (i) The students are provided with Borrower Cards. These cards are strictly non-transferable. The cards must be surrendered at the end of the session.
- (ii) One Borrower Card is issued to each student of H.S. class / TDC (General) class and he / she can borrow one book at a time. Two Borrower cards are issued to each student of Major subject and he / she can borrow two books at a time.
- (iii) No student is allowed to keep a book for more than 10 days in any case. A fine of 50 paise will be imposed for each day for book / books retained beyond the specified time. However, borrowed book / books, if returned before the expiry of the specified date, may be re-issued for a period of another 10 days.
- (iv) Any book lost, or damaged must be replaced by the borrower. If the book is one of a series and cannot be obtained singly, the whole set must be replaced by the borrower.

29. Book Bank:

The college has a Book Bank for helping the poor students with necessary and reference books.

30. College Uniform:

It is compulsory for the students of the college to wear uniform as prescribed below.

In addition to the prescribed uniform, students may be allowed to wear dresses in conformity with the colour of the prescribed uniform mentioned. However, decency in respect of dresses should strictly be maintained.

31. General Rules for students for maintenance of discipline

- (a) Students are required to maintain a high standard of discipline by adhering to the rules and regulations of the college.
- (b) Any of the following acts by a student shall be considered as a major offence against discipline and shall make him / her liable for stern disciplinary action:
 - (i) Involvement in ragging in the college campus.
 - (ii) Resorting to violence of any kind.
 - (iii) Adoption of unfair means in the examinations.

- (iv) Disobedience and indecent behaviour to any members of the teaching/the non - teaching staff of the college.
- (v) Damaging, defacing or devaluing any college property.
- (vi) Mobile phone is not allowed in the college campus.

32. Disciplinary Committee:

All powers of maintenance of discipline are vested with the Disciplinary Committee of the college comprising Principal, Vice Principal and seven members of the teaching and non-teaching staff of the college.

33. Examination:

The college holds both external and internal examinations, the details of which are as follows -

(A) External Examinations:

The college is recognised as Examination Centres of both G.U. and Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.

All the examinations of the TDC Course (Arts) of G.U. are conducted in the college Centre by a committee constituted in conformity with rules and regulations of G.U.

The H.S. 1st Year (Annual) and 2nd Year (Final) examinations of AHSEC are also conducted by a committee constituted as per rules and regulations of AHSEC.

(B) Internal Examinations:

The college holds internal examinations such as Test / Terminal / Sessional etc. There is a separate committee to conduct these examinations.

Besides, Unit Tests are conducted by the concerned departments.

34. Academic Calendar:

The college prepares its Annual Academic Calendar through which the number of class days / working days, the dates of important academic events such as - Terminal / Annual / Test Examination, Sessional Examination summer recess, autumn recess (Puja vacation) etc. are made known to the students at the beginning of each academic session so that they can plan their activities well in advance. Two separate copies of Academic calendar are enclosed to the prospectus.
