

#### Students' Satisfaction Survey 2018-2019


B.H.B. College, Sarupeta is situated in Barpeta district of Assam. It is affiliated to Gauhati University, Assam. The College offers B. A. and B. Com Programme at the UG level. The Students' Satisfaction Survey (mock drill) was conducted by the IQAC for the session 2018-2019. 49 responses were received through the online survey. The survey is conducted so that the students are oriented with the SSS. The responses are analyzed through statistical tools. For the analysis the data is presented through the pie-diagram which displays the percentages of the response of the students who undertook the mock drill. To conduct the mock drill of the SSS, an offline form was created and the hardcopy was given to the students who were asked to fill in their responses.

#### Q1. How much of the syllabus covered?

About 35% respondents reported that 85%-100% of the syllabus was completed by the concerned teachers. 41% reported that 70%-84% of the syllabus was completed. About 22% responded that 55%-69% and 1% emphasized that 30%-54% of the syllabus was covered.




- Q2. How well did the teachers prepare for the class?
  - 39% selected the option 'thoroughly', while 43% chose the option satisfactorily. The remaining 2% responded to the option 'poorly. While, 1% and 2% chose 'indifferently or 'won't teach at all' respectively.




## Q3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?

About 61% responded that the teachers were able to communicate the lesson 'always effectively'. 27% emphasized that the teachers were able to communicate the teaching material 'sometimes effectively'. Approximately 12% responded to the option 'Just Satisfactorily'.




## Q4. The teacher's approach to teaching can be best described as:




- Q5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers




- Q7. The institution takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students


The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth


Q9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.




Q10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes




- Q11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.


- Q12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications


- Q13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.
  - 63% of students responded that the teachers make an effort to 'fully' identify the strengths and encourage the students with providing the right level of challenges. 31% opted for the option reasonably. No student opted for 'partially', while 4% and 2% students opted for 'slightly' and 'unable to' respectively.




- 14. Teachers are able to identify your weakness and help you to overcome them
  - A good number of students (55%) 'strongly agreed' that the teachers were able to identify the weakness of the students and help them overcome them. 29% indicated that the teachers are able to identify the weakness of the students and help them over them 'moderately'. In addition, 16% of the respondents opted for 'somewhat', while None of the students opted for 'very little' and 'not at all'.




- Q15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process


- Q16. The institution/ teachers use student centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.


- Q17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.
  - 61% respondents responded to the option 'strongly agree. Another 35% chose to agree, while 2% opted to remain neutral. 0% students chose the option disagree while another 2% chose 'strongly disagree'.



- Q18. Efforts are made by the institute/teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.
  - 65% opted for the option 'to a great extent'. 27% opted for 'moderate' and 6%, 1% opted for "somewhat', 'very little' respectively and none chose 'not at all'.




- Q19. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, multimedia etc. while teaching.
  - 29% said that the teachers use ICT tools 'to a great extent'. 35.% opted for the option 'moderate' use of ICT by teachers. 22%, 6% and 8% responded to 'somewhat', 'very little' and 'not at all' respectively.



# 20. The overall quality of teaching-learning process in your institute is very good

The college endeavours to upgrade the teaching-learning process by introducing ICT tools, TLMs in its website. 55% respondents 'strongly agreed' that the teaching-learning process of the institute is good. 41% chose to opt for the option 'agree', while 4% chose to remain neutral. None of the students chose the options 'disagree and 'strongly disagree' respectively.



Q21. The question is a statement question that provides students with the opportunity to place three observations/suggestions that can help improve the teaching-learning experience. Of the many statements some of them are as follows:

- Students wanted more computers.
- · Students wanted the more digital classrooms.
- Students also pointed out that the classrooms should be renovated.
- · Students also placed the opinion that more teachers should be appointed against a vacant post.
- The responders also placed the opinion that the environment should be clean.

To analyse the responses of the students, the responses of the respondents available in percentages was brought to normal scale by data normalization. A scale 4 to 0 was used for the options A to E respectively, for all questions.




